Amal's journey from a successful career in Egypt's Ministry of Telecommunications to starting anew in the United States is a testament to resilience and hope. Forced to flee her home country in 2019 due to political shifts and fear for her life, she arrived in the U.S. with just \$400 in her pocket, facing numerous job rejections and struggling to restart her career in accounting and finance.

"At best, I would get an interview. At worst, I would hear nothing," Amal shares. "I heard a lot of nothing."

Everything changed when Amal connected with Upwardly Global. Through personalized coaching and support from her career coach Esmeralda, who helped her refine her resume and job search strategies, Amal secured an auditing position at the New York State Department of Labor.
