Shuttered storefronts, empty houses, and dwindling government funding —

changes made to shift away from industrial manufacturing in the late 1900s hit the U.S. Rust Belt hard. Once flourishing industry hubs — like Buffalo, New York, and Detroit, Michigan — faced significant population and economic decline. Where many saw a region past its prime, recently arrived immigrants, refugees, and asylees saw potential. They would be the ones to reinvest and revitalize the local communities, bringing Main Street back to life.

As the U.S. grapples with an aging population, a decline in birth rates, and labor shortages, all growth in the U.S. workforce is projected to come from immigrants and their children by 2035. Over the next decade, immigrants are expected to add \$7 trillion to the U.S. economy through their contributions.

When provided the opportunity to fully contribute and

tunity to fully contribute and enter the workforce at their skill level, immigrant, refugee, and asylee professionals help ensure the vibrancy and stability of local communities.

Upwardly Global works to dismantle employment barriers for work-authorized immigrant job seekers. The inclusion of their talents and skills in the U.S. drives local economic growth that leads to greater community resilience. Upwardly Global's tailored programming and career coaching address the specific needs of job seekers with international degrees and professional experience to help them rebuild their lives and restart their careers in the U.S.

With a goal to serve 25,000 job seekers in 2025, Upwardly Global is focused on expanding our reach through workforce partners, packaging our career-coaching model and online tools and resources to augment ca-

pacity in local organizations. Our work with partners, like the International Institute of Buffalo (IIB) and Global Detroit, to deliver support to immigrant professionals highlights

— they counteract population decline, pay taxes, start small businesses, and bring cultural richness that can rejuvenate cities and towns.

Upwardly Global is committed to building a sustainable ecosystem of partners with government agencies, community

By 2000, the industrial boom had ended, leaving many U.S. cities and towns in the Northeast and Midwest in economic distress. As key industries left and jobs became scarce, many residents moved away. The once shiny region had rusted in the eyes of many Americans, but soon, the arrival of new immigrants, refugees, and asylees would offer an opportunity for revitalization.

Efforts by local organizations and government agencies to promote resettlement in their region, along with low housing costs, encouraged many newcomers to put down roots in the Rust Belt. Feeling welcomed and supported, immigrants and refugees were able to build solid foundations and invest in their new communities. They helped revive local areas through their contributions to population growth, high rates of workforce participation, large tax contributions, spending power, and cultural diversity. We

have seen firsthand that the meaningful inclusion of newcomers results in long-term benefits for communities as a whole — new local businesses pop up, social services infrastruc-

ture is better funded, and jobs stay in the community.

To support revitalization in communities across the U.S., Upwardly Global is focused on scaling our work to reach more immigrant, refugee, and asylee professionals and identifying partners to help build long-term local capacity to better serve these newcomers.

CASE STUDY

Upstate New York's Path to Revitalization

The economic power and revitalizing influence of immigrants and refugees in the

U.S. is well documented. In **Syracuse and Buffalo**, immigrants and refugees have offset the decades-long population decline, helped create or preserve over 5,000 local manufacturing jobs, and boosted housing values by hundreds of millions of dollars. And this positive impact on the economy and broader community has only grown over the years.

Since 2022, Upwardly Global has served as a lead partner in New York State's Office of New Americans (ONA) Professional Pathways Program, collaborating closely with ONA to support immigrant-serving organizations statewide. First launched in 2021, New York State's Professional Pathways program helps immigrant job seekers access professional devel-

opment and identify skill-aligned job opportunities for low-income immigrants in highneed regions across the state.

Drawing from our nearly 25 years of experience, Upwardly Global curated e-learning pathways on the U.S. career search

for newcomers settling across

New York State. Our online portal serves as a knowledge base for job seekers to access resources related to career navigation, processes for licensing and credentialing, resume and interview preparation, and industry-specific content tailored to their professional needs. Upwardly Global also shared expertise and best practices from our own Career Coaching Program, training and mentoring job coaches employed by ONA and other local organizations to ensure immigrant job seekers receive meaningful, culturally sensitive support.

The International Institute of Buffalo (IIB), a refugee resettlement agency serving Buffalo and Western New York, is a local partner organization participating in the ONA Professional Pathways program. LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Upwardly Global works in collaboration with policymakers and coalition partners to champion legislation that dismantles barriers for immigrant professionals and creates legal and accessible pathways for newcomers to secure skill-aligned careers. Serving as a thought leader and partner in a number of federal initiatives, we have been proactive in identifying and centering the needs of immigrant and refugee job seekers to advance policies and narratives that foster thriving communities and promote economic growth.

As a member of the White House Task Force on New Americans, **Upwardly Global provided policy recommendations** to the Workforce Training and Development Subcommittee. We proposed investment in quality programs and differentiated services for newcomers with professional experience and international degrees. For newcomers to move beyond survival-wage jobs, they need access to robust career-navigator programs with targeted career pathways, job-readiness training and mentorship opportunities, and affordable English language programs. When implemented at the federal level, these action-oriented policies can increase economic outcomes for job seekers across the country, resulting in the revitalization of more areas like we have seen in Buffalo and Detroit.
